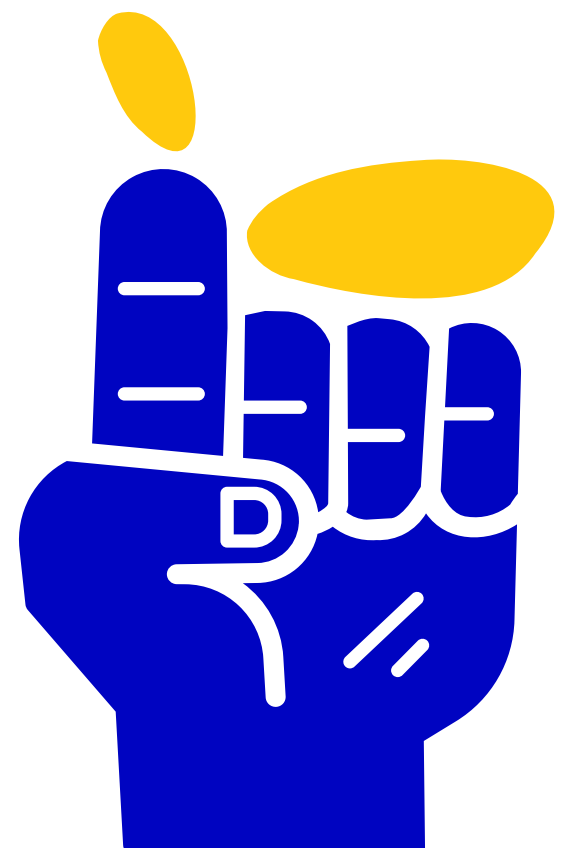

OUR SOLUTION: Peer (to Peer) Workshops

To address the issues highlighted previously, we aim to deliver a series of workshops developed by **youth for youth** that will cover basic HIV & STIs information, prevention, safer sex practices, anti-stigma education, being safe online, harm reduction strategies, as well as a variety of topics relevant to youth living with HIV and at-risk individuals.



Peer (to Peer) Workshops

Goal: Create a safe, inclusive space to learn about, better understand and discuss HIV-related topics.

Objectives

- Increase **access** to relevant sexual health information;
- Provide a **safe space** for knowledge exchange and discussions about sexual health, HIV prevention, stigma, substance use and more among youths;
- Give **youth** the opportunity to actively **engage** as leaders in HIV awareness and anti-stigma action.

Target Audience: High Schools in Ontario

(Minimum of 10 students, Maximum of 30 students per session)

OUR APPROACH: Peer (to Peer) Workshops

To create a unique, immersive and reflective learning experience for our participants, we adopted the **5E Experience Model** (5) and designed **two** fun, interactive and engaging workshops. Our workshops include games, trivia, quizzes, discussions, roleplays, and self-guided research.

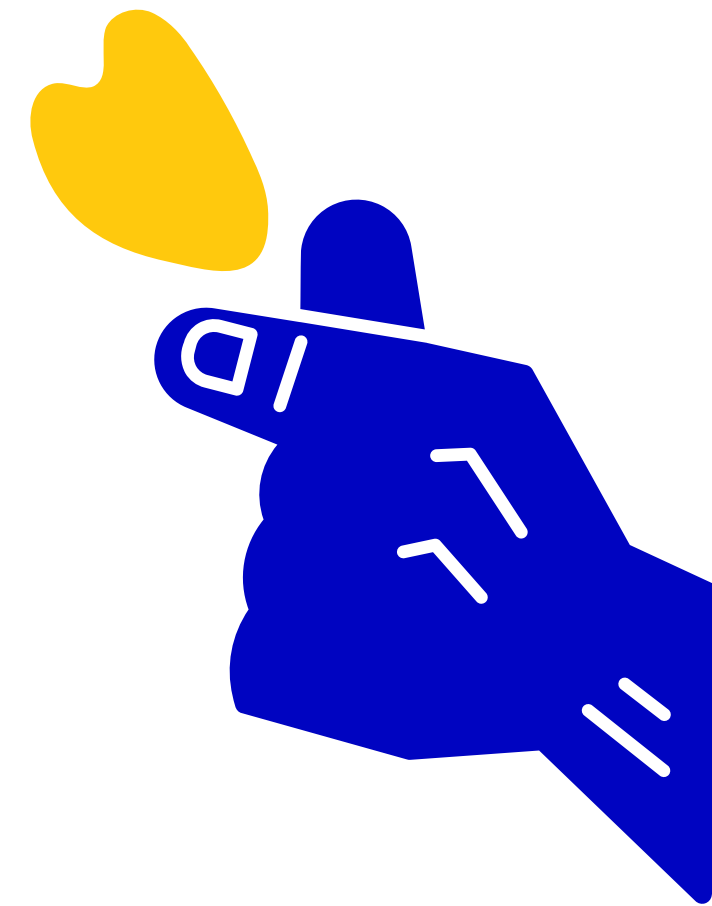


WORKSHOP 1

HIV & STIs Basics + Relationship, Dating and Sex

Focus areas

- What are STIs (STBBIs)?
- What is HIV?
- HIV Globally
- Transmission of HIV & STIs
- HIV and STIs Prevention strategies
- Info about STIs treatment/care in Ontario
- Different testing services = HIV Self-test kit, walk-in clinics, STIs testing
- Safer sex practices
- Navigating relationships = setting boundaries, giving & accepting consent



Duration of each workshop: 60 minutes

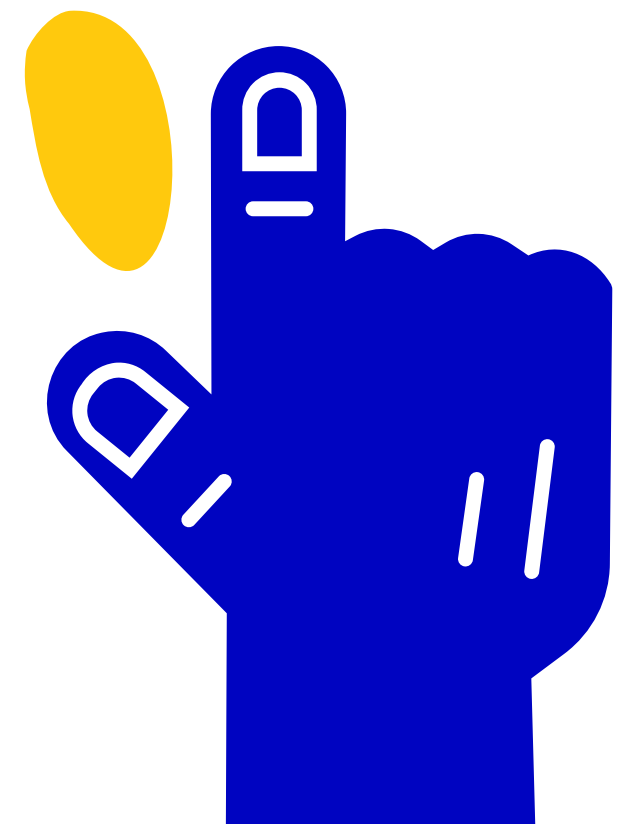
WORKSHOP 2

Harm Reduction + HIV Stigma and Mental Health

Focus areas

- Harm reduction strategies and services.
- Being safe online.
- Navigating peer pressure in different situations (party, friends, partners).
- De-stigmatizing HIV (prejudices, debunking myths, how stigma affects people affected by HIV, actions to take)
- Mental health (why it is important, resources, mental health care)
- Learn about intersectional factors that affect high-risk and priority populations

Duration of each workshop: 60 minutes

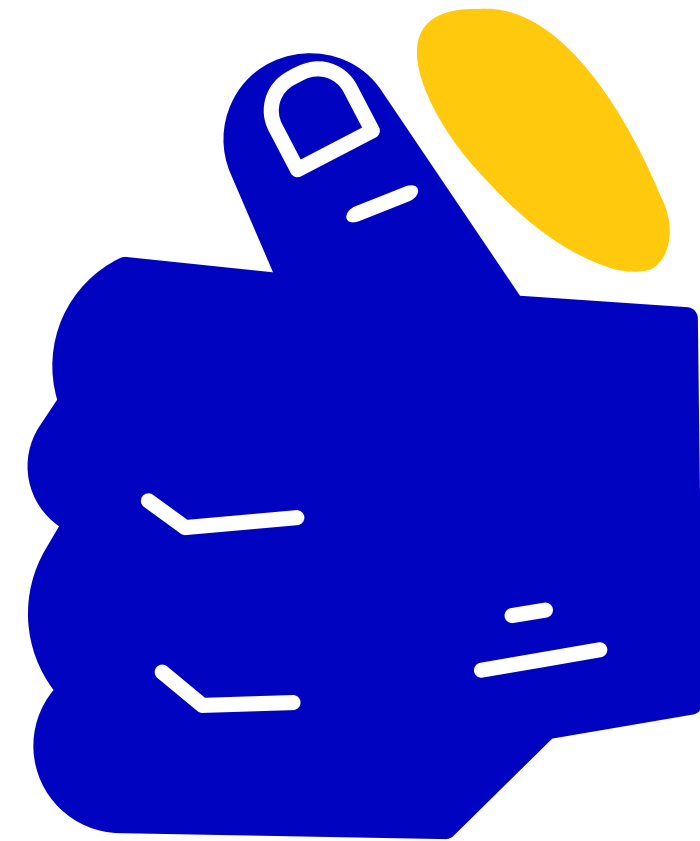

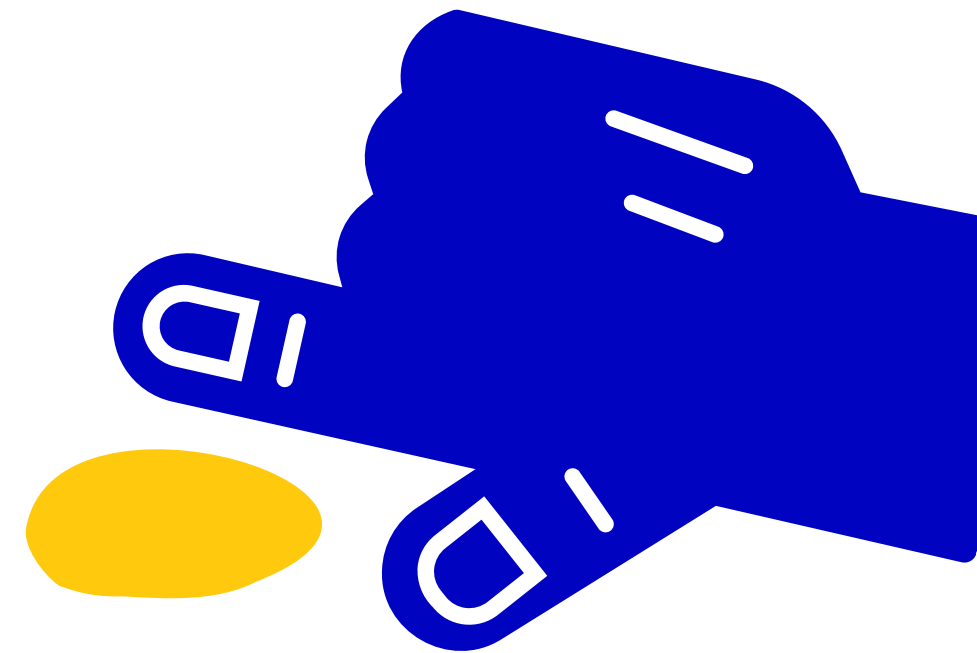
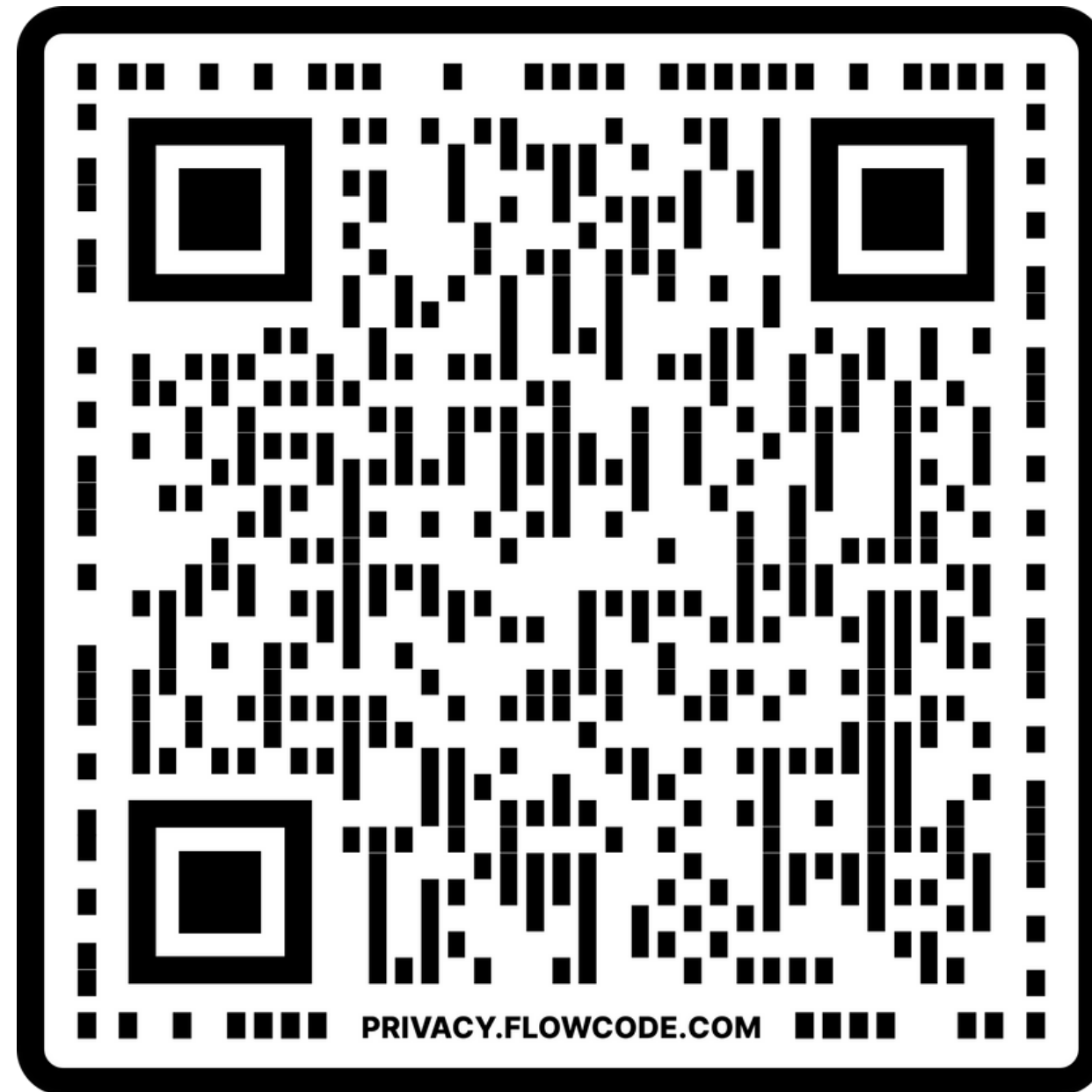
Workshops Delivery Methods: In-person
